

ANTARVYĀPTI (With Sanskrit Text and English Translation)

Antarvyāpti, hitherto an untouched area of Indian Logic, is the foundation of the Buddhist and the Jaina theory of anumāna. The book not only discusses the theory of antarvyāpti to its minutest details but also provides an English translation of *Antarvyāpti Samarthanam* of Ratnākaraśāntipāda and an edited version of this Sanskrit text. In this book the author, who himself is a student of Nyāya, tries to defend the Nyāya position.

Arun Mishra (born in December 1956) was trained in Nyāya by his uncle Pandit Kundanath, alias Phekan Mishra, in the family itself which till today is considered as the centre of Nyāya in Mithila. The author has translated *Vyāpati Nirņaya* and *Anupalabdhi Rabasya* of Ratnakīrti and Jñānaśrīmitra respectively. He is the editor of the volume *Spirituality, Science and Technology*, published by Indian Philosophical Congress. He has also published papers in various philosophical journals. At present he is working on *An Analysis of Nyāya Epistemology: From Gautama to Śańkara Miśra*.
